PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION
OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA

NO. 1

ARTICLE II, SECTION 8--Financial Disclosure Required Before Lobbying
By Former Legislators And Statewide Elected Officers.

Prohibits former legislators and statewide elected officers
from representing other persons or entities for compensation before
any state government body for a period of 2 years following vaca-
tion of office, unless they file full and public disclosure of
their financial interests.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 12--Searches and Seizures

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to provide
that the right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures
shall be construed in conformity with the 4th Amendment to the
United States Constitution and to provide that illegally seized
articles or information are inadmissible if decisions of the
United States Supreme Court make such evidence inadmissible.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 14--Pretrial Release and Detention

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution, effective
January 1, 1983, to provide that a person charged with a crime

shall be entitled to release before trial unless enumerated
conditions indicate that the person should be detained.
