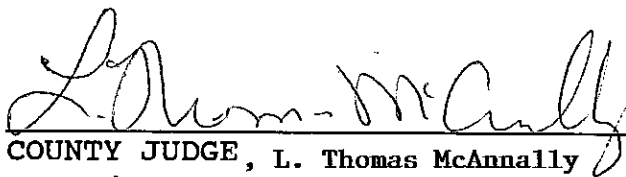

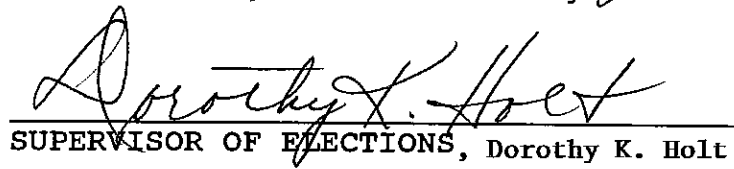

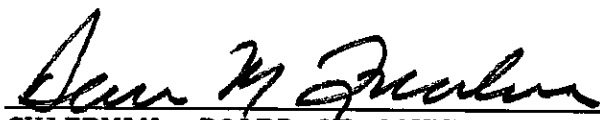

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION
OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA**

NUMBER 1

ARTICLE III, SECTION 3

REGULAR LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to require the Legislature to convene at an earlier specified date in 1991 and, in 1992 and thereafter, to convene on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February of each odd-numbered year and on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February, or such other date as may be fixed by law, of each even-numbered year.

NUMBER 2

ARTICLE I, SECTION 8

THREE-DAY WAITING PERIOD FOR HANDGUN PURCHASES

Requires a mandatory period of three days, excluding weekends and legal holidays, between the purchase and delivery at retail of any handgun. Defines the terms "purchase" and "handgun" and requires the Legislature to enact legislation to provide a felony penalty for violations.

ARTICLE VII, SECTION 18

**LAWS AFFECTING LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EXPENDITURES OR
ABILITY TO RAISE REVENUE OR RECEIVE STATE TAX REVENUE**

Excuses counties and municipalities from complying with general laws requiring them to spend funds unless: the law fulfills an important state interest; and it is enacted by two-thirds vote, or funding or funding sources are provided, or certain other conditions are met. Prohibits general laws that have certain negative fiscal consequences for counties and municipalities unless enacted by two-thirds vote. Exempts certain categories of laws from these requirements.

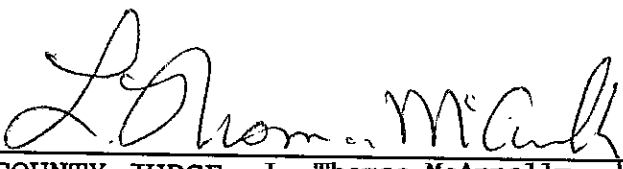

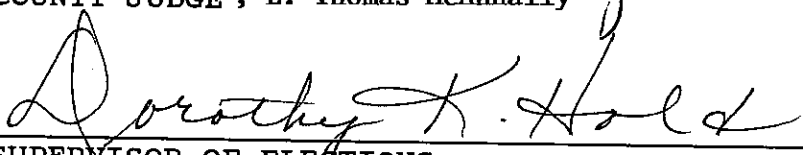

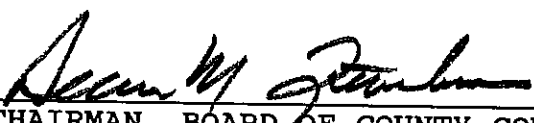
ARTICLE III, SECTION 4 - OPEN GOVERNMENT

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to provide that certain votes of legislators be recorded; that the Legislature provide by rule for open and noticed committee meetings and for certain other legislative meetings and meetings between the Governor, the President of the Senate, or the Speaker of the House to be reasonably open to the public; and that certain constitutional provisions relating to the Legislature be interpreted, implemented, and enforced solely by the Legislature.

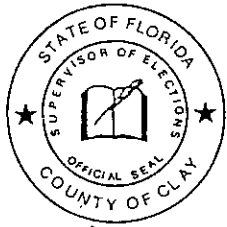

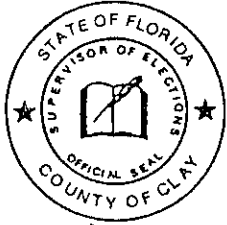

REPORT ON CONDUCT OF ELECTION
GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 6, 1990

1. The first precinct ballots to arrive were tabulated and incorrect tabulation was obvious. The A and B ballots were being tabulated only as A ballots. The canvassing board authorized deletion of the those results.
A status report showed the deletion.
Tabulation commenced with other ballots and all was well.
After tabulating seven precincts, the computer ceased function.
Tabulation was held up until we could discuss the problem with our out-of-town service representative.
On the reps advice, the computer was shut down for 60 seconds.
Computer was then brought up and status report was taken. All entries were intact.
Computer ceased function three more times during tabulation.
Each time it was brought up, a status report was taken and no previous entries were lost.
Thirty-one of thirty-two precincts were tabulated followed by a summary
Absentee ballots were then tabulated followed by a summary.
The first problem precinct was then tabulated with no further problem.

After discussion with the manufacturer's rep and Clay County support team, no explanation could be given for the glitch that gave the wrong tabulation of the first precinct ballots.
Steps are being taken to have the computer checked.
2. Many people who were issued absentee ballots went to the polls to vote without taking their absentee ballot. Since they could not surrender the ballot, voters were advised by the election board to go to the Supervisor of Elections office, sign an affidavit and vote absentee at the office. Needless to say, several were angry. Ignorance of the law rather than fraud was the voter's problem.

Suggestions: 1) An addition to instructions to absentee electors addressing this problem.
2) stamped instructions on the back of the outer absentee ballot envelope.
3. Four ballots from the 11/7/89 special election were found in Precinct 10 ballot box on 11/6/90
One ballot from the 11/7/89 special election was found in precinct 16 ballot box on 11/6/90.

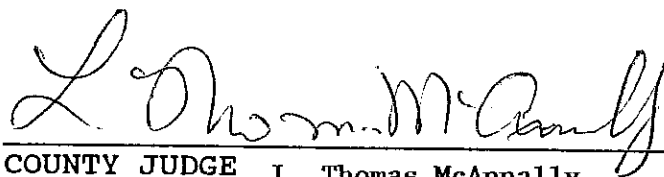

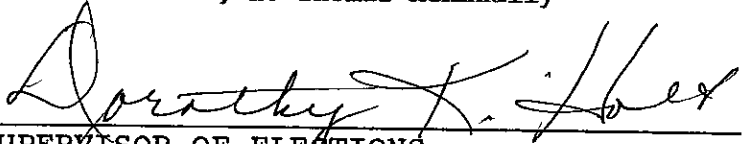

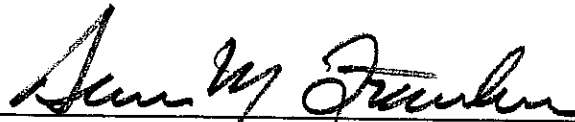

ARTICLE III, SECTION 3

REGULAR LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to require the Legislature to convene at an earlier specified date in 1991 and, in 1992 and thereafter, to convene on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February of each odd-numbered year and on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February, or such other date as may be fixed by law, of each even-numbered year.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 8

THREE-DAY WAITING PERIOD FOR HANDGUN PURCHASES

Requires a mandatory period of three days, excluding weekends and legal holidays, between the purchase and delivery at retail of any handgun. Defines the terms "purchase" and "handgun" and requires the Legislature to enact legislation to provide a felony penalty for violations.

ARTICLE VII, SECTION 18

**LAWS AFFECTING LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EXPENDITURES OR

Excuses counties and municipalities from complying with general laws requiring them to spend funds unless: the law fulfills an important state interest; and it is enacted by two-thirds vote, or funding or funding sources are provided, or certain other conditions are met. Prohibits general laws that have certain negative fiscal consequences for counties and municipalities unless enacted by two-thirds vote. Exempts certain categories of laws from these requirements.

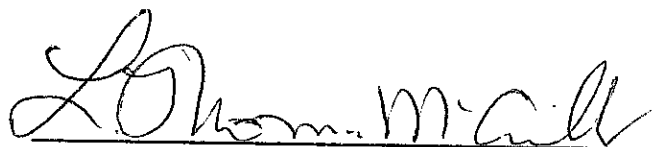

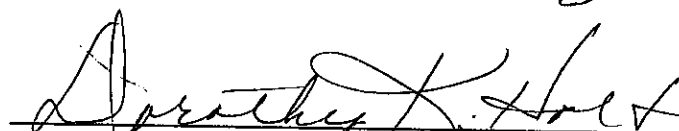

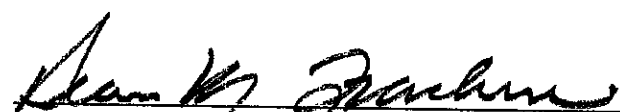
ARTICLE III, SECTION 4 - OPEN GOVERNMENT
